	 State Expo changes Blue ribbon requirement removed for the state expo, approved during the state leadership conference. This decision was for "equity and inclusion" There can no longer be a required qualifying show. This means you do not have to participate at fair to be eligible for state. Must update fair premium list information to reflect rule changes. Members must be in "good standing" with their county 4-H program to show at state. Each county can create their own determination of what is "good standing" County may require participation in a show for eligibility, but it can't be a specific show. Requirements for State Expo must be the same as for State Gymkhana and for the State Hunter/Dressage show. State packets will still be required to be turned in on Sunday of the fair. If members want to show at state but are not showing at fair, they must submit their packet prior to fair. Packets will be available at circuit shows for those not going to fair. State Expo will remain at the State Fair Park for a couple years due to contractual agreements. In order to deal with possible safety issues with removing qualifying (possible unprepared horses), class cut sizes will be reduced. Since fair qualifying is removed, there is concern over fair participation numbers. What can we do to encourage participation? Plan to take a poll at the mandatory meeting in January of who plans to show at fair. At January meeting, must decide what Waukesha will consider "good standing" for state participation.
